For the first time outside Iran: Iranian artist group BORJASS presents group exhibition in Dresden in person

With the support of the Stiftung Kunst und Musik für Dresden, the OSTRALE Biennale is currently exhibiting impressive works by the Iranian artist group Borjass from the city of Amol in the northern Iranian province of Mazandaran. The works can be seen outside Iran for the first time. Due to the current sanctions and the export licensing procedures, the group exhibition could only begin after a certain delay. It was only on the night of Tuesday (6 August) that the organizers were informed that the young artists were now also allowed to enter the country personally. This means that this year's OSTRALE Biennale will be able to host a special international cultural exchange with an extensive supporting programme. Among other things, it is planned that the artists will personally present their works to the visitors during a guided tour. Until 1 September, the OSTRALE Biennale will present over 300 works by around 180 artists from 34 nations in Dresden.

The OSTRALE Biennale is currently presenting a multifaceted special feature with the Borjass Group's exhibition of works, which was created almost secretly: works by a young group of artists from the Iranian city of Amol, a city in northern Iran near the Caspian Sea in the province of Mazandaran, can be seen. The city can be reached from Tehran after a three-hour drive through the gigantic and impressive Elbrus Mountains. The works of these young artists have never before been shown outside Iran – so far they have only been exhibited in their own country, among others in Tehran.

In their works, the artists explore their lives, their surroundings, their society and their own inner thinking. The viewer of the works gets an idea of the power, which is revealed in the artistic

work as well as in the result. Stories are to be discovered that here outside Iran - can receive a different, new interpretation. One member of the group says that artistic work gives the young Iranians a free space, teaches them and fulfills them.

The group exhibition is entitled "The Range":


In addition to oil and acrylic paintings, the exhibition includes drawings by **Akbar Nematirad**, which appear to the viewer as stills from a Fellini film - they tell about love and violence, street scenes are merging with a dream world, perspectives are reversed.







There is also a powerful collection of photographs taken on a street market in Iran, telling us the universal story of life and death and our habits, as photographer **Hamed Ghasemi (21)** explains in his own words: *"Human being colonizes anything he does not understand, so that he replaces others-loving with others-devouring. While this turns to a habit in lifestyle, human get used to it. Therefore the tradition of animal-eating became a habit. The blood streams that follow down from the animal's neck, his wondering eyes, his last scream as a*



In the group exhibition, drawings can also be seen that tell of the young artist Zeinab Fatemi's disagreements within the family. Here, themes are explored that are also highly relatable in our society.

Bettina Renner, who arranged the contact with the artist group and curated the group exhibition: "*I am very happy that the entire group is now allowed to come to Dresden to present their own artworks at the OSTRALE and to get to know all the people who are so eagerly waiting to meet them. I look forward to all the encounters and discoveries that are now possible".*



Martina de Maizière, Chairman of the Stiftung Kunst und Musik für Dresden: "I'm looking forward to getting to know the young Iranian artists and am excited about their world. It will be an enormous enrichment for the people of Dresden to experience their perspective, as they come from a country in which you have to deal with personal restrictions all the time".

Uwe Gaul, State Secretary of the Saxon state ministry for science and art (SMWK): "The exhibition of the Iranian artist group BORJASS is a win for the OSTRALE and for the artinterested public in Dresden. I am particularly pleased that the artists themselves can come here to make new contacts and take home lasting impressions of our society. I am already very excited about the conversation with them. Through them, we gain insight into the thinking of young artists who live in a country that is currently on everyone's lips in terms of world politics, but of which most of us know far too little. How do the artists work there, what moves them? What artistic traditions do they refer to? What does the world look like from their point of view and not just the big world, but that of real everyday life? Through the encounters in Dresden, Bautzen and Germany as a whole, we and they can learn a lot about each other. Concrete experiences with each other help to break down prejudices that almost always arise from ignorance. Here we have the opportunity to get to know interesting personalities and at the same time establish a universal connection across cultural and linguistic borders. The artists do not come from the big metropolises, but from the smaller city of Amol, and I find that particularly interesting, because in Saxony, too, great attention is currently paid to what we call "rural space" and its possibilities."

Andrea Hilger, Director of the OSTRALE Biennale: "Together with the Stiftung Kunst und Musik für Dresden and the Saxon State Ministry of Science and Art, we fought for a long time for the travel permit - many thanks to all our fellow combatants! Personally, I felt reminded of earlier times and based on earlier experiences I always believed that we would still receive the permit







at very short notice. Together with the guests of the OSTRALE we can look forward to really exciting encounters".

The artists themselves guide through their exhibition

For Saturday, August 10th, at 3 p.m., the OSTRALE Biennale invites interested visitors to guided tours with a special focus on the group exhibition. The artists **Hamid Asadzadeh**, **Zeinab Fatemi, Ali Fazeli, Hamed Ghasemi, Banafsheh Motevalli, Akbar Nematirad**, **Foroozan Soleymani**, accompanied by director Andrea Hilger and the curator of the group exhibition, Bettina Renner, will present their works. Participation in the guided tour costs 5 Euro (admission 15, reduced 10 Euro).

This year's OSTRALE Biennale is open until 1 September. A venue for the 2021 OSTRALE Biennale in Dresden is still to be found.

The OSTRALE Biennale has an excellent international network and is currently the third-largest temporary exhibition of contemporary art in Germany with over 300 works of art by around 180 artists from over 34 nations. It is not a sales exhibition per se, which gives it the freedom to discuss socially relevant topics away from market developments. The guiding principles of the OSTRALE, such as peaceful coexistence, acceptance of the stranger/unknown, respectful interaction, religious diversity and internationality are reflected in the exhibitions. The team of the OSTRALE Centre for Contemporary Arts has already organized several large-scale events contributing to the contemporary art programmes of European Capitals of Culture, such as 2010 in Pécs, 2016 in Wroclaw and 2018 in Valletta/Malta. In the European Capital of Culture 2020 Rijeka/Croatia, the OSTRALE will also contribute by shaping parts of the programme.

"Along with the couple of artists we settled at the Amol 2010 In city of Iran, possessing the same mindset while independently sharing the same goal toward developing the language of criticism. We decided to create an art group called Borjass (the moving goal in the air), while each individual, based on his/her own competencies, committed to study and investigate on the political, sociological, psychological and spiritual aspects of humans of the current era. We represented the artworks, 2015 establishing the Isoo Gallery in focusing on the common prohibitions and necessities that limit the freedom of life. During the recent years of our personal and professional development, we have shared our ideas and vision with both Iranian and international artists while designing contemporary art projects such as contemporary paintings, video arts, performances, voice arts and assemblages in order to reflect our notions."
